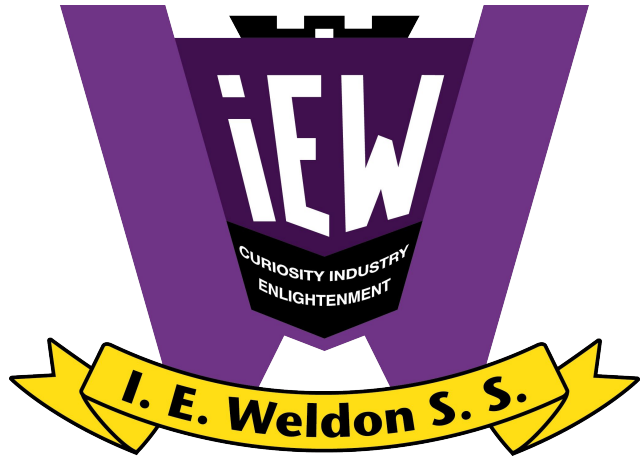

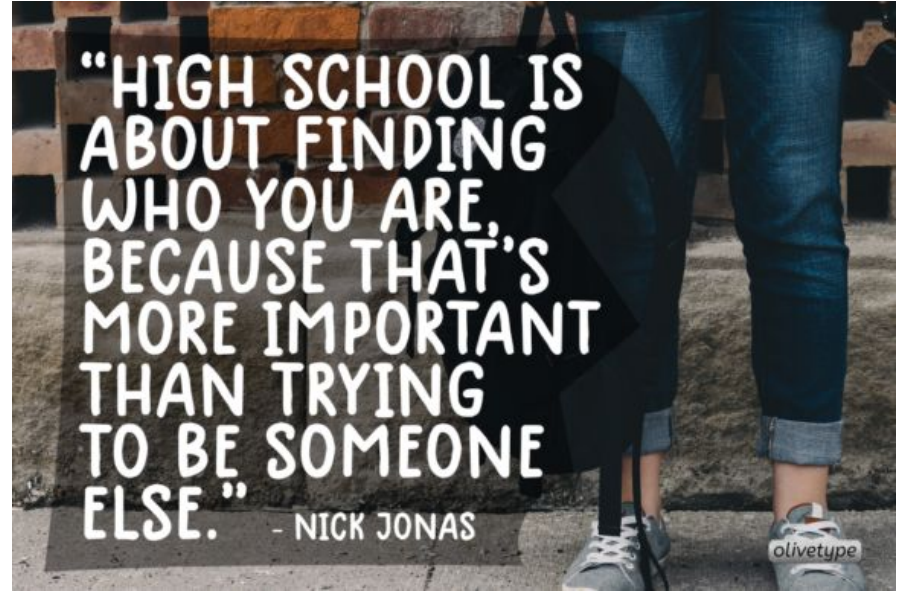

Graduation Options

COA - Certificate of Accomplishment

- Programming consists of life skills and mainly not-for-credit courses

OSSC - Ontario Secondary School Certificate

- 7 compulsory credits + 7 optional credits

OSSD - Ontario Secondary School Diploma

- 17 compulsory credits + 13 optional credits

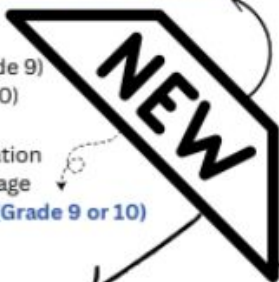


Full OSSD Graduation Requirements

Entering Grade 9 in 2024 or Later

17 Compulsory Credits

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade) *
- 3 credits in Mathematics (Grade 9, Grade 10, and 1 credit in either Grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography (Grade 9)
- 1 credit in Canadian History (Grade 10)
- 1 credit in the Arts**
- 1 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a Second Language
- **1 credit in Technological Education (Grade 9 or 10)**
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics and Citizenship
- **1 credit from the STEM-related course group**

Other Requirements:

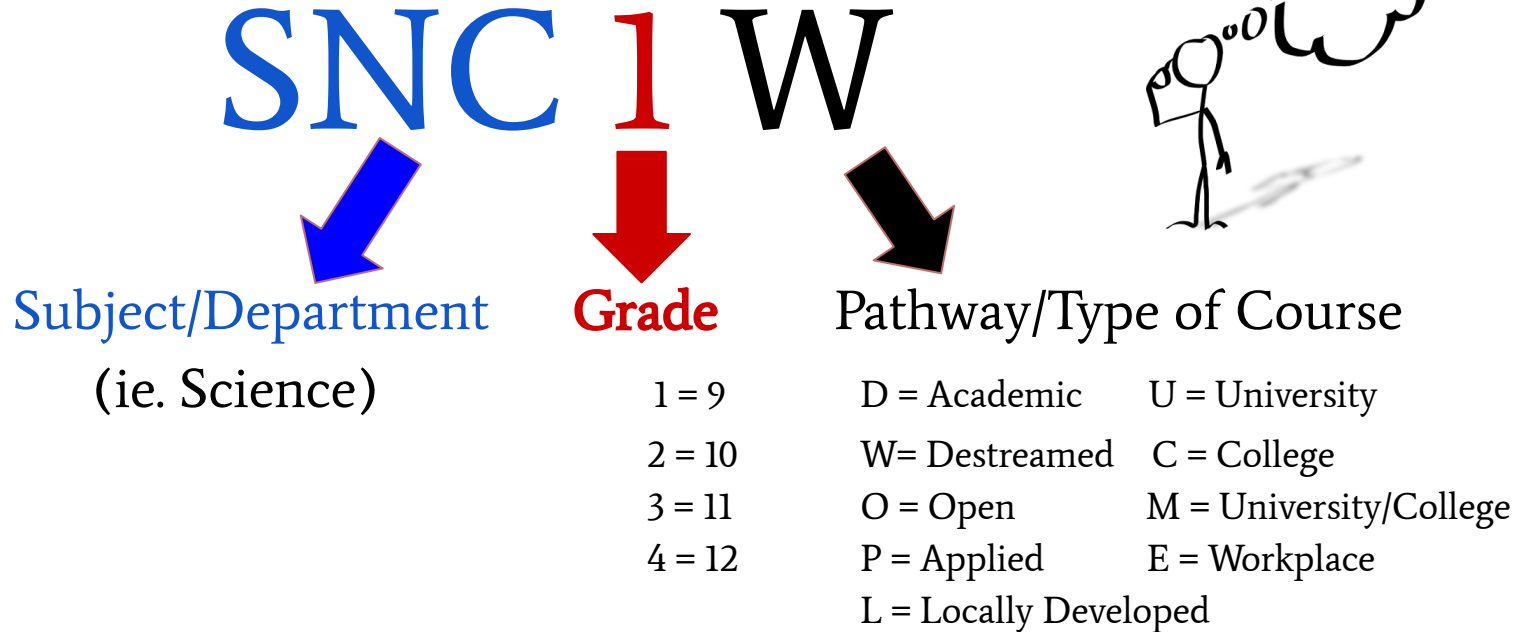

French Immersion Pathway

- Elementary French Immersion students have the option of continuing on in the program at IE Weldon. After the successful completion of **ten courses** taught in French in high school, students will earn a **French Immersion Certificate**.
- The French Immersion Program requires demonstrated interest in francophone cultures and languages. Students must show serious commitment to their written and spoken French in order to be successful in these credits.


