# Financial Planning, Scholarships & Bursaries

To help put a plan in place, you need to understand what the **costs of post-secondary education** are and where you will be accessing the funds from. Have informed conversations with your family network about paying for post-secondary training and education by using an online calculator to estimate the total costs. Most colleges and universities have webpages to help.

There is a significant amount of **financial aid** available to students pursuing studies at college or university - but it won't come looking for you! **It is your responsibility to research these opportunities and submit your applications.** If letters of recommendation are required from teachers, ask those who are most familiar with your attributes as a student and allow time for reference letters to be written. Familiarizing them with the specifics of the award for which you are applying allows them to compose a letter that highlights the most relevant points. **START EARLY!** The deadlines for applications vary greatly. Start researching early to ensure that you do not miss an opportunity. Read all scholarship application forms carefully – no two are the same!

- In the spring, you will receive a **Graduation Package** which will include a list of **I.E. Weldon Community Awards** with specific eligibility criteria. You must apply in your graduating year even if you plan to return to Weldon for additional courses. The spring Grad Package will also include an application form and instructions for the **Elizabeth Weldon Bursary** for all TLDSB students.
- Ask **parents and grandparents** about bursary and scholarship opportunities at their **places of employment, unions, professional groups or clubs** with which they are affiliated.

# Important Information about applying to Ontario Universities

Deadline for UNIVERSITY Applications is **JANUARY 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019**

## **Where to Apply:**

UNIVERSITY Applications are done through the Ontario Universities Application Center (OUAC) at [www.ouac.on.ca](http://www.ouac.on.ca) online. You will use an assigned PIN number to apply (PINs will be available likely late Oct./early Nov.)

You may make 3 choices for the non-refundable cost of \$150. Each additional choice is \$50.

*Important Note: Applying to 2 different programs at one school counts as 2 choices*

## **How to Apply:**

Be sure you have completed or are in the process of earning all secondary school **prerequisite courses** for entry to the program(s) to which you are applying.

Check to see if the program has any **additional requirements** for admission that you must have. Remember, there's a difference between something that is 'required' and something that is 'recommended.'

Check to be certain that **your marks** will meet (or preferably exceed) the admission averages required for the program(s) you are considering.

Proceed to [www.ouac.on.ca](http://www.ouac.on.ca) where you will be expected to create a login using your PIN. You can pick up your personal letter from the Guidance Secretary as soon as they become available (late Oct./early Nov.). The school number is also included with your PIN – you may have to add up to 6 zeroes at the start of it to have the 12 digits required. Program specific codes are required to complete your application. Check [www.electronicinfo.ca](http://www.electronicinfo.ca). Pay careful attention to the 'Submit' steps on the OUAC site. Remember, early applicants can make changes until the application deadline. If you have questions about the process, don't hesitate to contact the application center.

**OUAC will not process your application until the fee has been paid.**

**June 3, 2019** is the offer response deadline day for Ontario Universities.

Be sure to select a backup/fallback choice. Make at least one of your choices a program to which, based on your research, you are virtually certain you will be accepted.

Universities will see your second semester interim marks when making final decisions. Make every effort to have your interim marks reflect your true abilities by submitting assignments on time. Semester 2 final marks will also be considered and offers can be repealed in July based on these marks. Keep working until the end of the semester!

Any course dropped after the **Full Disclosure Date** for the semester (5 business days following interim reports) will appear on your transcript.

Some schools send out form letters requesting information that has actually been sent electronically from the high school. If you receive a letter requesting further information (transcript, etc), check the status of your application online and contact the college or university to see if they already have the necessary information **before** requesting it from the Guidance Office.

# Important Information about applying to Ontario Colleges

Deadline for College Applications is **FEBRUARY 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019**

## **Where to Apply:**

COLLEGE Applications are done through the Ontario College Applications System (OCAS) at [www.ontariocolleges.ca](http://www.ontariocolleges.ca) online.

You may make 5 choices for a cost of \$95. A maximum of 5 choices is allowed.

*Important Note: Applying to 2 different programs at one school counts as 2 choices; however, you may not apply to more than three programs at any one college*

## **How to Apply:**

Be sure you have completed or are in the process of earning all secondary school **prerequisite courses** for entry to the program(s) to which you are applying.

Check to see if the program has any **additional requirements** for admission that you must have. Remember, there's a difference between something that is 'required' and something that is 'recommended.'

Check to be certain that **your marks** will meet (or preferably exceed) the admission averages required for the program(s) you are considering.

Proceed to [www.ontariocolleges.ca](http://www.ontariocolleges.ca) where you will be expected to create an account using an email address and selecting a password. Once the account has been created, you will receive an email advising you to activate your account.

Once your account is activated, you can login and follow the steps outlined on the website to submit your application. Be sure to indicate on the application that I.E. Weldon S.S. is your **home school**. OCAS cannot connect you to your marks unless you do so. Remember, early applicants can make changes until the application deadline. If you have questions about the process, don't hesitate to contact the application center.

**Ontario Colleges will not process your application until the fee has been paid.**

## **Important Dates:**

**February 1, 2019** is the date on which Ontario colleges begin sending offers of admission.

**May 1, 2018** is the date by which acceptance must be confirmed.

**June 15, 2019** is the earliest date colleges may require payment of tuition fees.

Be sure to select a backup/fallback choice. Make at least one of your choices a program to which, based on your research, you are virtually certain you will be accepted.

Any course dropped after the **Full Disclosure Date** for the semester (5 business days following interim reports) will appear on your transcript.
